The Progressive Governance Digital Summit "Restart! A progressive agenda for a new normality in the post-pandemic world" will take place as a series of virtual encounters between June 15 and 19, 2020.

The #PGS event series

From Santiago via London, Oslo, Dublin, Copenhagen, Amsterdam and Stockholm to Berlin – Progressive Governance conferences and summits have been held worldwide since 1999. The cross-border dialogue series was originally founded by the British think tank, Policy Network. From the beginning, the purpose has been to gather leading as well as up-and-coming academics, activists and political decision-makers and to initiate a conversation about next generation thinking among centre-left parties and movements. The Progressive Governance event series aims at offering an intellectual ferment and cross-fertilization for a renewal of the progressive governing philosophy and political agenda across the transatlantic world. Since 2017, #PGS has been hosted in Berlin (#PGS17, #PGS19)









Progressive Governance Digital Summit 2020 (#PGS20)

Ten years after the global financial crisis, the coronavirus pandemic and its aftershocks will be one of the most serious challenges of our lifetime. It will be the greatest game changer for politicians, private sector leaders, public health systems as well as citizens nearly everywhere. A return to normality as we know it appears unlikely. As we move from crisis management to rebuilding the economy and society, a momentum for change is growing. Until now, solutions to the crisis have been designed at the national instead of transnational level, which hinders the much-needed cooperation.

To move forward, progressives need to learn from the lessons of these significant societal and economic shifts and the unforetold challenges that lie ahead of us, while contextualising them within the themes and values progressives hold dear. This is the purpose of #PGS20.



The 2020 edition of #PGS will give the next-generation thinkers and leaders a platform to rejuvenate the progressive spirit and create ideas for shaping the future. We are honoured to have **Olaf Scholz** (Vice-Chancellor, Germany) and **Hubertus Heil** (Federal Minister of Labour and Social Affairs, Germany) as patrons of the event.

Altogether, 100 international speakers will be exchanging ideas and developing concepts for change in 30+ sessions at the 2020 Progressive Governance Digital Summit. Among others, we are happy to welcome prominent political leaders, including **Annalena Baerbock** (Co-Chairwoman, Alliance 90/The Greens, Germany, TBC) **Katalin Cseh** (MEP, Momentum, Hungary), **Maria Ohisalo** (Minister of the Interior, Finland, TBC) political advisors and strategists, such as **Neera Tanden** (President, Center for American Progress, USA), **Clément Beaune** (Advisor for Europe and G20, Presidency of the French Republic), **Muthoni Wambu Kraal** (Head of Strategy and Organising, Democratic National Committee, USA) as well as thought leaders and public intellectuals: **Dani Rodrik**, (USA) **Maja Göpel** (Germany), **Yascha Mounk** (USA), Kübra Gümüşay, (Germany), **Matthew Taylor** (UK).

Main topics and key ideas

This crisis has revealed the structural weaknesses in our societies. We believe that it is imperative for progressives to promote international solidarity in times of crisis: how to achieve it will be the central objective of #PGS20. Solidarity will also be the normative guideline for the breakout sessions, workshops and leader's panels of #PGS20, in order to prioritise common solutions to the crisis. Further, the aim is to support the most weak and vulnerable and their communities at the local, national and global level.

At the 2020 Progressive Governance Digital Summit, we want to create an empowering moment that will lay the foundation of a new culture of governance. Therefore, we will focus on the following topics, essential for rebuilding the foundations of progressive politics:

Transformation: Creating a sustainable recovery & just transition agenda

• Renewing the parameters of innovative, carbon-neutral, digital and globalised economies that foster welfare, social equity and social mobility

Democracy: Winning the struggle for liberal democracy

 Rebalancing the responsibilities between the state and society with the aim of empowering civil society, promoting social cohesion and innovating the democratic system

Leadership: Building capacities for progressives to govern

• Imagining a narrative for an inclusive vision of the future, winning the public argument and developing strategies for progressives to govern

Europe +: Making a progressive case for Europe & new multilateralism

 Keeping Europe and its friends close together, whilst shaping values and institutions in times of geopolitical shifts
